The National Trust for Historic Preservation invites applications for the **2024-2025 Silman Fellow for Preservation Engineering**. This 12-month fellowship provides a recent graduate with the opportunity to work on various restoration, rehabilitation, and preservation projects at the Trust's 27 sites nationwide and work at TYLin's Silman Structural Solutions practice as a structural engineer.

Projects at the Trust may involve master planning, condition assessments, consultant team selection, technical research, materials conservation methods, preventive and corrective maintenance, contract documents, bidding and negotiation practices, contractor selection, job site administration, and distribution of grant funds.

The Silman Fellow is required to complete a deliverable for the benefit to the field of historic preservation that is suitable for presentation and/or publication. Upon successful completion of the Fellowship, the Fellow will continue as a full-time TYLin employee.

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Frequently Asked Questions

What are the graduate degree requirements?

Candidates should have either:

- 1. A Master of Science (M.S.) or Master of Arts (M.A.) in Historic Preservation
- 2. A M.S. in Structural or Architectural Engineering with a demonstrated academic background in historic preservation.

What are the undergraduate degree requirements?

Candidates should have a Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in Civil, Architectural, or Structural Engineering.

What is the salary?

The salary will be within a competitive range of starting salaries for recent graduates. Prior relevant professional work experience will be considered.

Are benefits included (health insurance, vacation, etc.)?

Benefits are provided by TYLin while working at both TYLin and the Trust. Benefit packages will be presented at the time of interview to selected candidates.

What defines a recent graduate?

A recent graduate for this upcoming fellowship position would include Fall 2023, Spring 2024, and Summer 2024 graduates.

Can technical work experience substitute for a M.S. degree?

No. A M.S. in one of the fields listed above or a similar degree is required.

Where will the fellowship take place?

The Silman Fellow will spend six months at one of TYLin's offices prior to starting a position for the next six months as the Silman Fellow for Preservation Engineering with the National Trust. The Fellow may be posted to a combination of time at one of TYLin's offices and Trust historic sites.

When does the fellowship start?

The fellowship is targeted to start in Fall 2024.

What happens when I've completed my fellowship?

Fellows return to full-time employment at one of TYLin's offices following the completion of their six months at the Trust.
